

Cucumber

Cucumbers

- Grown for eating fresh or preserving as pickles
- Mature quickly and best suited for large gardens
- Do best in loose sandy loam soil, but can be grown in any well-drained soil
- Grow in full sun
- Roots can reach 36 to 48 inches deep do not plant where tree roots will rob them of water and nutrients

Cucumbers – Soil Preparation




Figure 1. When preparing the soil, turn over the soil to a depth of 8 to 12 inches and add fertilizer and organic matter.




Figure 2. Work the soll Into beds 4 to 6 Inches high and at least 36 Inches apart.

Cucumber - Planting

- Require warm temperatures and cannot survive frost
- Vine crop requiring a lot of space vines can reach
 6 to 8 feet long or more
- Drop 3 or 4 seeds in groups every 12 to 14 inches down the row; thin extra plants after emergence
- Can train cucumbers on fence, trellis or cage if wire is available

Cucumber - Fertilizing

- Require plenty of fertilizer
- Scatter 1 cup of 10-10-10 or 10-20-10 for each 10 feet of row when planting
- When the vines are 10 to 12 inches long, apply about ½ cup fertilizer for each 10 feet of row
- Water weekly if it does not rain

Cucumber – Care During Season

- Do not plow or hoe the soil deeper than 1 inch because you may cut feeder roots and slow plant's growth
- Cucumbers produce male and female flowers
 - Male flowers open first and always drop off
 - Female flowers form cucumbers and should not drop off

Cucumber - Insects

Name and description		Control
Banded cucumber	Banded cucumber beetle, ¼ Inch long; yellow-green with 3 yellow bands	Pyrethrins or rotenone
Spotted Cucumber	Spotted cucumber beetle, ¼ Inch long; yellow-green with 12 black spots	Pyrethrin or rotenone
Squash bug	Squash bug, up to 1 Inch long; gray-brown, reddish brown when small	Sevin or Thiodan

Cucumber - Harvesting

 Harvest when cucumbers reach the desired size and are green in color

Yellow cucumbers are over mature and will have a

strong flavor
